Bring 'n' Brag: Dominic Martinelli stated he had 6 entries in the category of Motive Power without Steam, including 2 display

only entries: an E-7 Locomotive of the NYC and an N Scale Freight House. In the voted contest, first place with his Conrail and Penn Central Locomotives went to Dennis Lippert; second place went to Kevin Squires for his N scale center cab switcher in an eyeglass case, and third place went to Rick Montgomery for his GE Dash-8 locomotive in Norfolk Southern dress.

T-Trak Committee: Jimmy Braum and Richie Jodon were not present, so no report. The Superintendent made an announcement that Kevin Squire to take over T-Trak for the Division. The T-Trak Display will be at the Monaca Train Show coming up in March.

- Neil Schorr took the floor and announced that his O Scale Layout after 27 years and 5 months to the day is completely finished. He will have his layout open on Sunday


June 22nd for our monthly division meeting, so plan on visiting his outstanding layout, which has been in numerous calendars and articles in model railroad magazines.



The February Bring 'n' Brag category was **Motive Power: Diesel, Electric, Traction**. We had six entries in all, plus two for display only.



Denny Lippert won **first place** for his two HO scale GP30s (above), one a Walthers Proto 2K in Penn Central livery (bought for \$40 at a train show ca. 1999), but which he upgraded over the years with detail parts, paint, and weathering; and the other a ScaleTrains model in Conrail blue, purchased last year. He notes that the cost of the latter was about \$225 (including the decoder he added), or about double what he spent on and put into the older model, which for its time was state of the art, to finish it to his taste and to suitably display next to the newer locomotive.

Second Place went to **Kevin Squires**, for his N scale center cab diesel, modeled on the TCKR switcher engine prototype (center right and cover). He provided a prototype photo and list of upgrades that he made to this model, which he bought to solve his



his Ingle-nook puzzle.

There is more detail about his entry on page 9.



The **third place** winner was **Rick Montgomery**, who entered his HO scale model of a GE Dash-8 locomotive (center left), which bore the LMX livery before he added number boards, painted and decaled it as Norfolk Southern 7003. He has also lightly weathered the model.

Beyond these three, another 3 members entered models in the contest, and there were two "For Display Only" models as well.

Erik Fritzberg entered a pair of O scale Alco RSD-12s in PRR livery (bottom right).



March 16: Morgantown, WV





Athearn Blue Box HO kit given to me by a co-worker.
 Cleaned and lubed, no electrical upgrades at this time.
 KD #37 couplers.
 Added 3rd brake cylinders to center axles.
 American Model Builders window set.
 Detail Associates eye bolts (long hood sides), firecracker antenna, coupler lift bars.
 Details West MU cables and hoses, Leslie RS-5TRF horn, NW/SOU front mount bell, circular vent.
 Tichy grab irons.
 Factory paint plus accents and started weathering.
 Shell Scale decals for numberboards, small stencils.

The other “display only” model was submitted by an anonymous member (no name left): an N scale 3d-printed PRR Freight House (below), along with some documentation presumably of its siting (Steubenville) and age (built ca.1881).



As noted on page 6 above, **Kevin Squires** also provided detailed information about how he modified his center cab diesel switcher to approximate the prototype photo (bottom right). How he came upon the idea of creating a diorama in an eyeglass case is a story he is reserving for another day, but it reminds the editor of a layout he once saw in a Berlin shop window: an HO scale layout, with running trains and two levels, built inside of a guitar case!



Steve Ross entered his HO scale model of an SD40-2, NW 6185, which began life as an Athearn blue box model. He provided a prototype photo and a list of details (montage at left) that he added to the model (which is pictured on page 10 below the RPM announcement).

Mike DeSensi entered an N scale GP30, Santa Fe #1255 (below).



Two entries were brought “for Display Only” (i.e. not to be voted upon in the contest). One of these entries was a brass E7 locomotive in O scale (below), from **Erik Fritzberg**. The interior even featured one of the 567A prime movers.



I needed to create a locomotive that could be used with my small Inglenook layout. To do so, I wanted it to be a diesel locomotive, and painted in the TCKR color scheme. I used the existing Turtle Creek center cab as inspiration. Starting with the Kato Pocket-Line Steeple Cab (see at the left above). I then did the following:

- Removed the pantograph
- Removed the roof roof awnings
- Painted the green & yellow of the Turtle Creek Industrial Railroad
- Added an Engineer/Driver
- Added window glazing
- Added center dividers as seen on the hoods of the prototype



Railroad Prototype Modelers – East 2025

The next RPM East convention will be held at the Westmoreland County Community College in Youngwood, PA on **Friday, March 21 and Saturday, March 22**. This event is sponsored by Division 2 and alternates between western PA in odd years and eastern PA (Malvern) in even years. Other than 2021 it has been featured since the 1990s.

The **Railroad Prototype Modelers** (RPM for short) meets are like a typical NMRA regional convention, but with a couple of differences and some fewer activities, i.e. no non-rail clinics or prototype tours. Thursday evening, March 20, starts with optional operating sessions at nearby layouts. Slots are limited, so preregistration is required. A number of clinics on modeling, railroad history, and prototype equipment are presented on Friday and Saturday. There is a large room to display prototype models (not a contest). In process models are often shown so construction features can be seen and discussed. Everyone is encouraged to bring something to display. In 2023 we had over 500 models. Additionally, there is a large room with high quality vendors such as CMP Shops and Funaro & Camerlengo. This room is shared with various railroad historical societies. So far, we have commitments from Friends of the EBT, NYC System Historical Society, the P&WV Technical & Historical Society, and the B&O Historical Society.

Breaks are provided for lunch and dinner. There is a café in the WCCC building and numerous nearby restaurants in Youngwood, Greensburg, or New Stanton. Registration is a very reasonable: \$40 until February 28, \$45 afterwards. Single day registration is available for \$20. You can pay at the door, although preregistration is encouraged. See additional information, photos, and registration forms on our website – www.hansmanns.org/rpm_east/.

We hope to see you there!



Norfolk & Western Railway No. 6185 started out as an Athearn blue box model of an SD40-2, and Steve Ross transformed it into a super-detailed and lightly weathered SD40-2. 




